The design of God, from the time of the New Testament forward, has been to work through the local church *and* the church in its missionary form.

Two words used to describe these forms are *Modality* and *Sodality*.

Modality & Sodality (Local/Pastoral) (Mobile/Apostolic)

Implications:

- 1. The church in its apostolic, missionary form (sodality) is as equally "church" as the church in its local, parish form (modality). God designed each to uniquely advance Christ's Kingdom. (*Think Paul and his apostolic missionary team*)
- 2. History affirms that whenever these two structures work cooperatively and interdependently, the Christian movement thrives and moves forward.
- 3. Apostolic leaders (*Kingdom entrepreneurs*) and their misson/vision thrive best in structures designed for the fulfillment of their calling.
- 4. Apostolic leaders and apostolic structures "have an irreplaceable purpose in maintaining ongoing missional capacities, generating new forms of ecclesia, and working for the continual renewing of the church, among many other vital functions." *Sam Metcalf p. 87*

One more clarification ...

Regarding Gospel Movements

(Generic) Movement defined: "The sociological phenomenon that takes place when a group of people work together to passionately advance their shared commitments." (Abolition of slavery, Civil rights, Environmental, Feminist)

Apostolic (Gospel) Movement: When the Spirit of God breathes supernatural power into a movement so that the focus of the movement is the good news of Jesus and his kingdom's presence. The result is typically societal transformation. (The Reformation, First & Second Great Awakening, Welsh Revival of 1908)

"Apostolic (gospel) movements occur when the good news of Jesus spreads contagiously – like a relational virus – through a network of social relationships whereby many people become committed followers of Jesus and groups of these disciples rapidly multiply, radically impacting whole towns, cities, and nations with the presence of his kingdom." Sam Metcalf, Beyond the Local Church, p. 169.


Tracy and Debra ...

So ... are Tracy and Debra a modality or a sodality?


Because of the nature of their vision – to help people thrive in their relationship with Jesus in order to advance Christ's Kingdom by mobilizing believers, leaders, and churches into a gospel movement of visible unity - their vision and mission can best be accomplished by coming alongside local churches, networks and movements as a supportive catalyst, awakening the Church to its unified identity and calling. As such, they function as a sodality or an apostolic structure.

None of the literature addressing modalities and sodalities writes from the perspective of the collective Church of the City.



Typically when the two structures (Local Church and Apostolic Structure) are combined the result continues to be <u>independent churches</u> working in alignment with a sodalic movement.

When the collective Church of the city serves in unity with other apostolic structures (sodalities) the result is a transforming expression of ecclesia.



When a unified Church of the city collaborates with apostolic structures, the synergistic result is greater than the sum total the churches could accomplish independently.


We are serving Christ in an amazing era of Church history. The Spirit of God is at work and fresh expressions of the church are being birthed
